As a high school counselor, she developed a life-skills curriculum, and addressed pupils' personal and academic issues. During this time, she went back to graduate school and obtained certification as a school psychologist.

Now retired, Alyce has found enrichment as a member of WCCP. In particular, she was thrilled to be a part of the scholarship committee and took great pleasure in meeting extraordinary candidates.

Alyce enjoys Broadway shows, museums, history and travel. On her most profound trip to Europe, she went to Italy and connected with other members of her grandfather's family. She has forged ongoing relationships with these relatives, which make her feel closer to her roots. She is especially proud of her three lovely granddaughters.


