Dorothy Eady: the most mysterious and unique Egyptologist January 15, 1:00 PM Stockton Education Center at Morven

Bruce Jeffries-Cox will be our speaker on January 15. His presentation is entitled, "Dorothy Eady: the most mysterious and unique Egyptologist."

Bruce explains that many prominent scientists and explorers have studied Egypt over the centuries. He describes these explorers as either brash, cautious, flamboyant, or so ponderous "they could make turtles yawn." Yet Dorothy Eady, a young woman born in England who never earned any advanced academic degree, became one of the most respected and accomplished Egyptologists who ever lived. Bruce will present her story.

Before his retirement Bruce had his own company which analyzed the news coverage of major companies. However, a major part of his career was spent at AT&T, where he held several positions,



culminating in the corporation's Director of Public Relations Research. Bruce did his undergraduate and graduate work at the University of Pennsylvania and Columbia University. In addition, he holds academic certificates from prestigious universities in America and Europe.

Bruce is also a professional musician. He has performed widely and has released CDs of original music. He has developed seminars in many subjects, including the search for Planet X!


The tour starts at 10:15 am sharp and will be approximately 2 hours in duration. We already have 15 members who signed up at the December meeting. Please join us!
